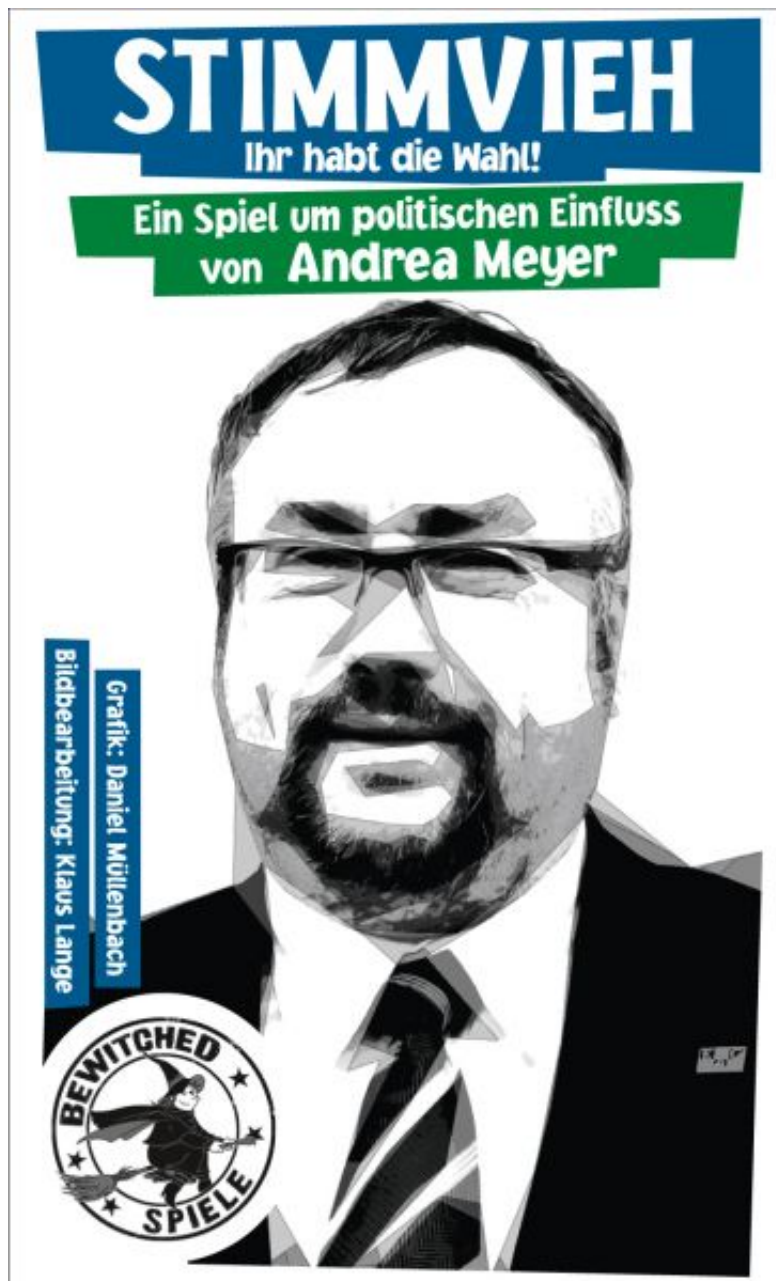


The original version of 1998

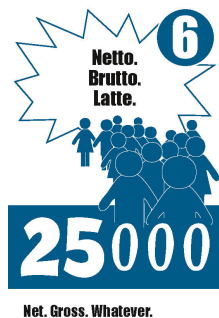

You send top candidates and backbenchers to collect donations and votes - and restrict the other players' options. Sometimes it makes sense to use a more popular politician than necessary, in order to not provide the next player with what they need.





The new and completely revised version contains 90 large-size cards, among them

- 24 donation cards
- 17 vote cards
- 4 party cards
- 36 influence cards in 4 party colours
- 2 Angelus cards for the 3-player-variant
- 2 cards "donations" und "votes"
- 4 overviews
- 1 blank vote card for your favorite slogan

Of course the game also includes a rulebook in German and English.
